Annual World AIDS Day Event Coordinator, Paulding.

Free information sessions & HIV testing has been made available to all to GHC students, faculty, staff, and the community through the annual event. Guest speakers & HIV testing materials have been recruited from the AIDS Resource Council and the Georgia Department of Public Health (Northwest Health District). Partnerships through the event have been formed with the AIDS Resource Council, Georgia Department of Public Health, Douglas & Cobb Public Health, and the Paulding County Health Department. Additionally, in an ongoing effort to promote HIV awareness and increase access to care, students have been referred to the partners for testing and to complete HIV extra credit assignments outside of the event. Three hundred and fifty five total participants to-date.

Prevent Cancer Initiative
